

# Saints trio make a big splash in series

THREE St Ives Swimmers won overall trophies as the Peterborough Grand Prix Mini Meet Series came to an end.

The series was made up of four rounds, with each competitor taking part in three swims in each round, made up of either the 200m individual medley or 200m freestyle, then followed by two individual 50m events in either backstroke, breaststroke, freestyle or butterfly.

The top six swimmers received awards, including Saints trio of Sebastian Di Siena, who was second nine-year-old boy, Hazel Sterling, second 10-year-old girl, and Hanna Jaskiewicz, who was fifth nine-year-old girl.

Saints also saw a hatful of personal best times achieved on the night. Other swimmers who also competed were: Katie Smith, Luke Wilson, Martha Waters, Eleanor Rogers, Michael Lardner, Catrina Green, Anna Banks, Caroline McKenzie, Rhiannon Pritchard, Jasmine Asplin, Oliver White, Samuel Cox, Hannah Howe, Katie Hughes, Stanley Waters and Benjamin Wilson.

St Ives finished a pleasing fifth overall in the series, behind the much bigger clubs of City of Peterborough, Milton Keynes, Biggleswade and Kettering.

It follows success for Di Siena, Sterling and Jaskiewicz at the British Gas Cambridgeshire County Championships.

Di Siena became county champion in four freestyle events, over 50m, 400m, 800m and 1,500m, breaking county records in the 800m and 1,500m. He is now ranked first regionally and third nationally.

Jaskiewicz won Gold in 50m breaststroke, 100m and 200m IM, 400m freestyle, and 50m backstroke, while Sterling was champion in the 50m breaststroke, 100m and 200m IM, 100m freestyle and 50m, 100m and 200m backstroke.
